

What Construction Employers Should Know About OSHA Enforcement Under the Biden Administration

Steve's take-home message to construction employers is to continue to "place a focus on employee safety and health by investing resources into identifying and eliminating hazards on their worksites." He adds that, "in doing so they will be better positioned to manage their workforces under the Biden administration by ensuring their COVID-19 safety policies and procedures, along with their safety training and hazard assessments, are compliant with CDC guidance and current OSHA regulations."
